



Don and Fran Haley - 2007

- First civilian officials to be voted into the Hall of Fame
- Both served in the strength sports of Weightlifting, Powerlifting and Physique Competitions for over 50 years as competitors and officials
- Served as Head Officials for California Police Athletic Federation lifting sports from the First California Police Olympics in 1967 through the California Police and Fire Games in 2004
- Don and Fran developed a team of the best and most highly regarded officials in the lifting sports to officiate in the California Police and Fire Games
- Don has been inducted into the National Weightlifting Hall of Fame
- Don and Fran have been recognized by and utilized as International Referees by numerous Federations including the U.S.P.F., the A.A.U., the American Weightlifting Assn., Special Olympics International, Western States Police and Fire Games, World Police and Fire Games, International Paralympic Committee and Disabled Sports U.S.A.
- Don is a past National Chairman of the National A.A.U Weightlifting Committee and Past President of the United States Powerlifting Federation and chaired the original A.A.U. committee that published the original rules for Powerlifting
- Their Loyalty and Dedication to the Police Officers and Firefighters competing in the Police and Fire Games Weight sports is unsurpassed.

Robert A. Buckman - 2007

- Competed in his first Games in 1969.
- Has 81 medals, all but 2 medals have been for Track & Field
- Has set 4 records during his participation
- Graduated from Sacramento State University with a B.A. in Police Science and Administration
- Sworn in as Deputy Sheriff in 1961, promoted to Sergeant in 1968 and retired in 1992



Lawrence (Larry) J. Moore - 2007

- Competed in his first Games in 1967
- Created the TCA (Toughest Competitor Alive) competition
- Became a member of the CPAF Board of Directors in 1984
- Has set numerous records in swimming
- Was an All American Water-Polo player in college
- Competed on an unbeaten LAPD Water Polo Team
- Was the second Athletic Director for LAPD
- In 1985, with Chuck Foote, created the Baker to Vegas Relay Challenge
- Retired from LAPD in 1995 after 31 years of service
